

Biomedical Research Funding-at-a-Glance **South Carolina**



National Institutes of Health Funding for South Carolina¹

- In FY2016, South Carolina received 432 NIH-funded grants through normal appropriations process, totaling \$179,069,761.
- This represents an increase of \$26.6 million from FY2015 and 21 more grants.

National Science Foundation Funding for South Carolina²

- In FY2016, NSF provided 167 awards totaling over \$60 million.

NIH Helping Communities

What does NIH funding mean for the South Carolina economy?

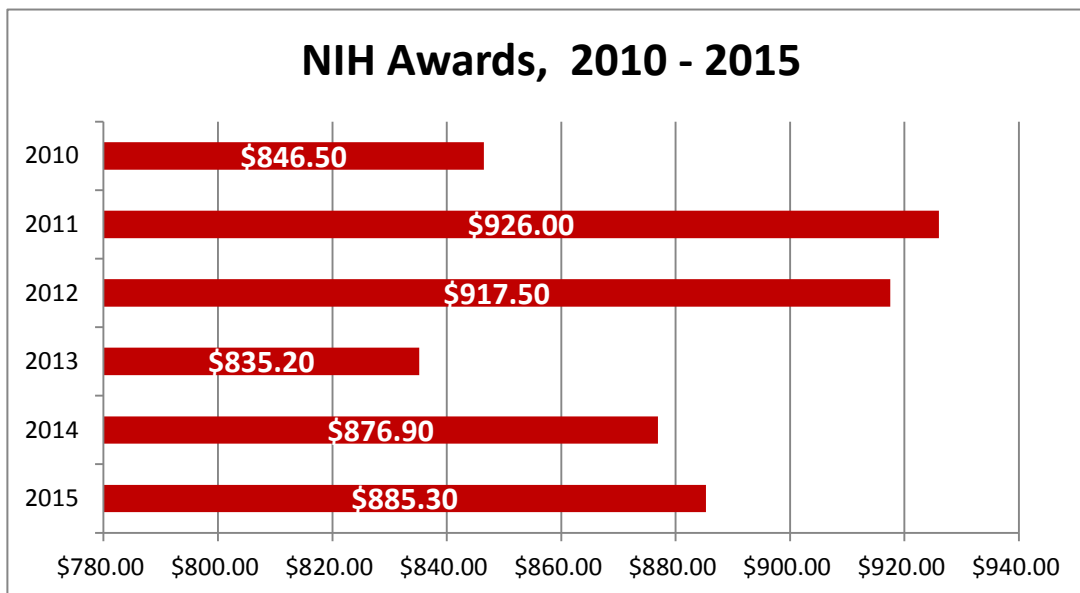
- In FY2007, each NIH dollar invested in South Carolina generated \$2.15 in new state business activity³.
- In FY2016, the NIH supported \$490.5 million in economic activity and 3,547 jobs⁴.

Life Science Industry Impact⁵

- 36,300 individuals are employed directly in life science jobs.
- The average annual wage for life sciences jobs is 86,400.
